<p>Lesson Objectives:</p> <p>Student will: Research the cultures of China and Japan through architecture and belief systems from 600-1450.</p> <p>Present their contrasts and comparisons in a presentation format.</p> <p>Write about how the site affects culture both in that society and surrounding cultures.</p>

Lesson 1:

10 minutes:

Large Group - View World Heritage Sites on *Windows and Mirrors* DVD-Asia Make students aware of the Chinese and Japanese sites.

10 minutes:

Assignment overview. Pairs of students will be assigned a time frame in which to research cultural sites and belief systems in both cultures.

20 minutes:

Students use print and digital media to research the World Heritage Sites. Students use the CulturalJam.org website to find pictures of their sites for examples of architecture and other images related to belief system.

Lesson 2:

5 minutes.

Questions and answers on previous days work

35 minutes

Students will continue to research and develop presentation on their time period.

Lesson 3

Students will present their information comparing and contrasting China and Japan in their time period. Presentation will be 4-5 minutes in length.
