Lesson 1:

10 minutes:

Large Group- View Religions and Spirituality module on *Windows and Mirrors Asia* DVD, and Customs and Rituals on *Windows and Mirrors Asia* DVD

20 minutes:

Divide students evenly between religions listed. Small groups will research where the religion is practiced, any holy sites related to the religion, and politics related to the religion.

Students will research customs and rituals of the country and how they relate or don't relate to religion. Using the Cultural Jambalaya website students will find religious and spiritual images.

15 minutes:

Large group presentation and discussion on the various religions, non- religions, spirituality, customs and rituals.
